Crest is a national award that recognises over 10 hours of independent scientific planning, research, experimentation, analysis and evaluation on a topic of the students' choice. Udayvir and Aditya chose to investigate the strength of various bridge designs by adding masses to the models they built and Bradley tested the safety of ships by making hulls of various shapes and seeing how long they would stay afloat if damaged.

## Young Citizens Bar Mock Trial

I was chatting to Cameron Noble, Year 12, in our Restaurant whilst he was on duty, ably supporting staff in supervising the lunch queue! Having told me about the Mock trial, he kindly wrote this review, which I share with you now. 'On Saturday, we participated in the regional heat of the Young Citizens Bar Mock Trial competition at the Inner London Crown Court. This competition provided us with a fantastic opportunity to step into the positions of legal professionals and gain an insight into how our justice system operates. As a team, we assumed key roles within a typical Crown Court trial, such as barristers, witnesses, court clerks, and ushers and we drafted legal arguments for both the prosecution and defence of specially written cases. After weeks of preparation, we brought our cases to the courtroom where we went head-to-head with other schools. This tested not only our critical thinking and public speaking skills but also our determination and teamwork under pressure. Out of twelve competing schools, we secured third place, narrowly missing out on a spot in the national finals. Nevertheless, this experience has been both rewarding and inspiring and we look forward to achieving even more success next year.'

# **Volunteer Support**

Academy schools (which is our status) are required to formally appoint an Accounting Officer (usually the Head), a qualified CFO (in our case, the Finance Director) but also appoint a '<u>Responsible Officer</u>'.
