DROP-OFF

THE LATE SHIV MISTRY

Shiv Mistry was a student here, 2015-2022,who sadly died whilst on a post-A levels holiday with his RGS friends. A very able young man, Shiv had a place at Cambridge. He died from anaphylactic shock having been in a coma shortly after taking a sip or two of a non-alcoholic drink which he had been assured was dairy-free. This was a very distressing incident - his friends bravely attempted CPR - and, of course, devastating for his grieving family. His friends have been very keen to raise money for Anaphylaxis UK and I have agreed that the 'non-uniform' day in October can be the 'good cause', which indeed it is. Shiv's father has created an App called 'Shivlet' which is an allergy communication tool.

SIXTH FORM OPEN EVENING 22 OCTOBER

This is an important event for our Year 11 students to attend, as they consider their A level courses. The vast majority of our students stay on at RGS and, assuming they qualify, are allocated ahead of external students into A level courses. The fact that we are admitting female students (not 'allowing girls to join the Sixth Form' as the Bucks Free Press put it!) has attracted attention locally with even the BBC taking an interest; I was interviewed on the Three Counties Radio breakfast show last week, with RGS being the main item of news. Shyan Bera, Year 13 has written a piece regarding our success in this prestigious competition - and a win against Wellington: 'The RGS High Wycombe Hans Woyda Maths team took part in the 1st Regional Round against Wellington College on Tuesday 1st October. Hans Woyda is a competition containing both 'individual' and 'team rounds' of mathematically based questions to be solved under tenacious time pressure. The squad began strongly, gaining a two point lead in the starters and steadily building that up through to the team round. Tasked with finding as many ways as possible to compose 500 from square numbers, the team smashed this round, demonstrating resilience and scoring 7 points to Wellington's 4. For those interested, here's an interesting question with a twist: What's the next term in the sequence 61, 52, 63, 94, 46, ...?

Overall, the RGSHW team of Shyan Bera (Y13), Tharul Wanni-Arachchige (Y12), Isaac Workman (Y11) and James Heaven (Y9) put in a great performance to defeat Wellington College by 47 points to 28. Our new Head of Cricket, Mr Pardoe, is not only an experienced coach who spent last year coaching on Worcestershire's Academy, but he also continues to play at a high level himself. Mr Pardoe is captain of Herefordshire who play in the National Counties competition - which is 2nd class cricket. Herefordshire gained promotion in the Championship this season and reached the QF of the T20 competition under Mr Pardoe's leadership. Mr Pardoe was awarded Herefordshire's Player of the Season for his all round contributions with bat and ball, including a season high score of 184 v Dorset. He also had a successful club season at Halesowen CC in the Birmingham League. He was awarded Players Player of the Season, 1st XI player of the season, and Best Individual Performance of a season for a game in which he scored 150 and took three wickets to secure a victory for Halesowen.
