Message from Vik Kapoor, Chair, Friends of Rugby of RGSHW

Dear Year 7 parent

On behalf of the Friends of Rugby of RGSHW committee (FRORGS), welcome to the 2024/25 season at RGS.

RGSHW has a proud heritage of producing top class rugby teams and players. The school aims to instil a love of rugby for all boys, and to compete with best rugby playing schools in the country. Our fixtures take us to schools all over the south of England and the Midlands, and often further afield in cup games. We play against the very best independent schools in the country, including Brighton College, Wellington College and Whitgift as well as a few state schools such as Campion. Last year, for the first time since 2018 due to Covid, our Senior Squad toured and 45 boys headed off to South Africa for the trip of a lifetime. This is something every RGS rugby player can aspire to when they get to Years 12 and 13. There is also a short domestic tour for Year 9 each year.

The last two years have been hugely successful; in 2023 the 1st XV won the National Schools Plate final against Barnard Castle at the StoneX Stadium having beaten Epsom College and Monmouth along the way. A great achievement and our first national senior final since Mr Honeyben was in his RGS uniform! Last season was equally as good, with the 1st XV reaching the quarter finals of the National Schools Cup, and narrowly losing in the final of the prestigious St Joseph's Festival in Ipswich.

FRORGS is a group of volunteer parents that support the rugby programme at RGS. Broadly speaking, we have two functions:

- To assist with communication between RGS and parents in relation to rugby
- To organise fundraising events during the year.

Each year group has a representative who is the first port of call for any questions you may have and the channel of communication from the School to parents. We already have a volunteer for Year 7, Nick Stroud, and he will be in touch with you shortly. It is great to have two reps per year group to spread the load and so if you are the parent of a keen rugby player and keen to get involved yourself, please let Nick or Mr Honeyben know.

As to fundraising, in short we need to raise around £60,000 a year to support the rugby programme. The majority of parents donate subscriptions to the rugby programme at RGS. Subscriptions are the second biggest revenue stream for FRORGS after the Sportsman's Dinner (see below) and are vital to reach our fundraising target. Most parents donate by monthly direct debit but there are those who make annual payments. We will have a presentation to Year 7 parents on 14 September at 8.30am where we will talk about this in more detail.

A separate message will go out in School comms about our biggest fundraising event of the year, the Sportsman's Dinner, which we are holding on 7 November 2024. This is always a great evening led by ex-England international and renowned presenter and pundit, David Flatman. This year our guest speaker is Ben Youngs. Please come along if you can as it will get you into the swing of what being a rugby parent at RGS is all about. Tables are for 10 or 12 guests, but if you have a smaller group or want to join a Year 7 table please let myself or Nick know. The event is open to everyone including non RGS parents so please do bring your friends alona.

We have other events planned: a comedy night in the New Year; an end of season Awards Night for Year 7-9 on Wednesday 26 March 2025 and a Touch Rugby & Beer Festival on Saturday 21 June 2025 (the Saturday after the last A level exam). Please put these dates in the diary and come along to support them.
